2. Electrical and network information concerning the competition

One RJ45 per team table will be provided in each major competition league. Each team must come with a switch to connect more than one computer to the network. Organize your network but the Wifi will be forbidden (except for robots competition).

Each table will have an electrical french plug (see section 6). However no electrical extension cord nor universal plug is arranged for the team area, so participants have to bring their own to the competition league.

3. Transport

- General information*

For the purposes of the RoboCup, the organizing committee, supported by Bordeaux metropole and Bordeaux convention bureau, undertakes to provide the participants with **free transport passes** for a period of 9 days (starting from the first validation). These passes will be sent to the RoboCuper prior to the competition as digital passes working with NFC.

6. Electrical Extension Cord and Universal Plug

General information

For France there are two associated plug types, types C and E. Plug type C is the plug which has two round pins and plug type E is the plug which has two round pins and a hole for the socket's male earthing pin. France operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz



Voltage converters and transformers -

Electricity supplies worldwide can vary from anything between 100V and 240V. It can be extremely dangerous to use an electrical appliance that is rated at a voltage different from the supply.As voltage can differ from country to country, you may need to use a voltage converter or transformer whilst in France.Please find more information on the following website : Travel Adaptor for France | Electrical Safety First



7. What's the weather like in Bordeaux in July ?

- Temperature

The average daily temperature jumps up to 21°C (about 69°F), plenty warm for sightseeing outdoors. The highs jump up to 26°C (around 79°F), the hottest temperatures this area will see all year. At night, the lows get down to 15°C (around 59°F), still warm enough to enjoy a glass of wine outdoors at one of the city's many vineyards. With these temperatures, you can pack the short-sleeve shirts and shorts for the daytime hours. At night, you might want a jacket or light sweater.

- Extreme Temperatures

Typically, this area has steady temperatures without a lot of extreme highs and lows. The highest recorded temperature this part of Western Europe has ever seen was a very balmy 39°C (about 102°F). The lowest temperature dropped down to 9°C (around 48°F), pretty chilly for a summer month. You most likely won't see temperatures like this, but check the local forecast each day to be sure.
